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Dear students, parents/caretakers, teachers and others,

We have started the 5th year of 'Bridge HDT' on the primary schools in Amsterdam Southeast full of enthousiasm! Since September 22, 74 students receive Bridge High Dosage Tutoring (Bridge HDT). The students are grouped in pairs, who all have their own tutor. We will provide tutoring lessons for all these students. We are very thankful to be welcomed in the schools again and are looking forward to our collaboration. The students receive tutoring lessons of 60 minutes two times a week, during school hours.

The method of HDT comes from the United States. The organisation who provides HDT there is called Saga Education and they consult our organization and projects. Our projects are also monitored by a research team of the University of Amsterdam. The results are very positive and show that students can improve in math because of HDT.

Our team of Bridge HDT exists of seven professional tutors and me, the Site Director and Program Manager (Lieselot Roelandts). We are supported by the Central Office of The Bridge. The weeks before lessons started, the tutors have participated in training and getting acquainted. Aside from this training, tutors receive biweekly feedback from me through observing of their tutoring. As an organisation, we believe that anyone, young or old, can grow and develop themselves on a personal and professional level.

The tutors will contact the parents/caretakers every 3 weeks to keep them up to date about the tutoring lessons. We also exchange information with the teachers so that we can support the students as well as possible.

We are looking forward to collaborating with you all this school year!

Frequently Asked Questions

1. What does the abbreviation HDT stand for?

HDT stands for 'High Dosage Tutoring'. This means that students in permanent pairs receive extra arithmetic lessons every day for a school year from a permanent tutor. During the tutor lessons, each student receives tailor-made education.

2. How many hours per week do the students receive HDT?

De students receive 60 minutes of class two times per week. In total the students receive 2 hours of class per week.
